Front View a Operation panel Controls the machine.

Rear View a USB port Connect the USB Universal Serial Bus cable. When no operations are performed for a specified number of minutes, the machine automatically enters the energy saver mode. The Energy Saver key goes off and the machine enters the standby mode. NOTE Depending on how long it was in the energy saver mode, the machine requires approximately 15 to 180 seconds to be fully restored from the energy saver mode. Print Media Requirements Storing Paper The quality of paper may deteriorate if it is stored improperly even when the paper meets the normal specifications. CAUTION When loading paper, take care not to cut your hands on the edges of the paper.CAUTION Do not touch the lock release levers located on the right and left sides of the paper cassette when the plate of the paper cassette is locked. The plate may snap forcefully if the lock is released and may result in personal injuries. Adjust both sides of the paper guide to the mark of the desired paper size. Paper limit mark CAUTION When loading paper, be careful not to cut your hands with the edges of the paper. If it does not fit correctly, it may result in misfeeds. Paper feed direction Press down the paper stack so that it is loaded under the hook on the paper guides. Open the multipurpose tray. Hold the grip at the center of the front surface of the printer. Pull out the auxiliary tray. IMPORTANT Be sure to pull out the auxiliary tray when loading paper in the multipurpose tray. 210 Loading Paper. Closing the MultiPurpose Tray Close the multipurpose tray using the following procedure. Keep the multipurpose tray closed when it is not used. Remove any loaded paper, close the extension tray, and then put the auxiliary tray back to the original position. Open the multipurpose tray and pull out the auxiliary tray. Place the stack of envelopes on a flat surface, flatten them to release any remaining air, and be sure that the edges are pressed tightly. Align the edges of the envelopes on a flat surface.

Gently load the stack of envelopes with the address side facing up and the flap side come the leftward. Be sure to insert the envelopes completely. It may result in a faulty operation. Each time you change the paper size you load in the cassette or the multipurpose tray, it is necessary to specify

the paper size according to the following. When using paper other than plain paper, you can specify the paper type according to the following. Specifying the paper type can prevent poor copy quality, or the printout not being printed correctly. Face up paper output delivers paper with the printed side up from the output area. Select the area depending on your purpose by opening or closing the face up cover. Paper is stacked in printed order. Close the face up cover. This way is convenient for printing on transparencies, or envelopes which tend to curl, because the paper is delivered straight through out of the machine. Open the face up cover. Document Requirements The documents you place on the platen glass or loaded in the ADF for copying, scanning, or sending must meet these requirements Type of Plain paper. Gently lower the platen glass cover. The document is now ready for scanning. Loading Documents in the ADF Fan the edges that will feed into the machine first, then tap the edges of multiple page documents on a flat surface to even the stack. Load the documents face up in the ADF. Setting Up Documents The machine scans documents from the first page. Before Printing. Load paper in the cassette or the multipurpose tray. Select the command to print. Doubleclick the corresponding printer driver icon. More Information. It also describes the special copy features. Three modes are available for adjusting the image quality. The exposure has to be manually adjusted in color copying. You can select from the following. These features allow you to sort copies in page order and create special copies easily. Collate Copy Sorts copies in page order.

Reserve Copy Reserves the next job while the machine is printing out. Collate Copy The collate copy allows you to sort copies in page order. The machine begins scanning from the first page of the document. The machine scans the next document and then prints only one copy. Repeat step 5 and 6 to scan all documents and the machine prints only one copy for each document. NOTE When scanning multiple page documents,. More Information. NOTE If there is no job, is displayed. Periodic Cleaning Your machine requires little periodic maintenance. This section describes the necessary cleaning procedures for your machine. Cleaning the ADF Area Black lines may appear in copies when the ADF is used to feed documents. This is caused by paste, ink, correction fluid, or other foreign matters in the read area of the platen glass shaded area. This is what causes black lines on copies. Whenever you load a document in the ADF, always check to make sure that any paste, ink, or correction fluid that is on the document is completely dry. When other paper has already been loaded in the multipurpose tray, remove it before loading the cleaning page. If the spent toner cartridge is not in the replacement position, close the cover, then open it again when the whirring sound stops. Repeat this process until the cartridge you want to replace is in the correct position. Open the protective bag with scissors, so as not to damage the cartridge. Be sure to carry out this procedure properly. The image quality may deteriorate if you do so. Do not apply shock to the toner cartridge memory or bring it near magnetic waves as this may result in damage to the machine. If the sealing tape remains in the toner cartridge, it may result in a deterioration in print quality. Close the cartridge cover and lower the scanning platform. The toner cartridge holder will rotate automatically. Careless handling can damage delicate mechanical parts or cause deterioration of the print quality.

Please read the following notices before installing or removing the toner cartridges. WARNING Do not burn or throw used toner cartridges into open flames, as this may cause the toner remaining inside the cartridges to ignite resulting in burns or a fire. materials a and b by hooking your fingers into the tab and pulling them in the direction of the arrows. Remove the packing materials c and d by turning them in the direction of the arrows until they stop and pulling them away. Hold the packing material g and remove it as shown in the figure. Pull up the green handle on the drum cartridge in the direction of the arrow a, and lift the cartridge straight up b. Be careful not to touch the drum or open the drum or touch the portions that are not described for this procedure such as the sensors. The image quality may deteriorate. Be sure to hold the grip securely when carrying a fuser unit. Dropping the unit may result in personal injuries. Open the suboutput tray. Tilt both the green pressure release lever on the left and right side of the fuser unit towards you to release the pressure in the fuser unit. IMPORTANT If the paper completely winds around the fusing roller and is impossible to be removed, contact your Canon dealer. Return the green pressure release levers on the fuser unit to their original positions. Close the suboutput tray. Lock the fuser unit by turning the two lock release levers in the direction of the arrow. Connect the power cord and all interface cables. Plug the power cord in the wall outlet to turn on the machine. If the message is still displayed after turning on the machine, pieces of torn paper may still

be remaining inside. Turn the knob on the drum cartridge in the direction of the arrow. Lift the cover and remove the jammed paper Clearing Jams. The image quality may deteriorate.

Return the cover to its original position direction of the arrow Proceed to the next steps to remove the jammed paper. Widen the document guides until they stop, and remove the paper so as not to be caught by the guides. Open the ADF and gently remove the jammed paper from the ADF. Therefore, there may be cases when the color on the screen cannot be printed out exactly as it appears. Wait for a while. After connecting the power cord, the machine cannot scan documents immediately. Is the document loaded correctly.
